Further to the territorial subdivision, in June 2009, of 58 electoral districts into polling subdivisions, for the purposes of the general election on Sunday, November 1, 2009

Presentation

Order in council 645-2005, which was adopted on June 23, 2005, established the electoral process and the division into boroughs and electoral districts for the general election of 2005, as well as the composition of the city council and borough councils.

The order in council was renewed for the purposes of the general election on November 1, 2009, and for any by-election to be held before the general election in 2013, in accordance with section 38 of the Act to amend various legislative provisions respecting municipal affairs (2007, chapter 33). Despite the adoption by the city council of the By-law concerning electoral districts (08-018) on May 26, 2008, Ville-Marie borough constituted an exception as the composition of its borough council, as well as the division into electoral districts, were amended under sections 25 and 47 of the Act to amend various legislative provisions concerning Montréal (2008, chapter 19).

Thus, in the 19 boroughs and 58 electoral districts established on the territory, the following 103 elective offices will have to be filled on November 1, 2009:

- ✓ City mayor
- ✓ 18 borough mayors, who are also city councillors
- ✓ 46 city councillors
- ✓ 38 borough councillors

In addition, at the end of this election:

- ✓ the city council will be made up of the city mayor and 64 city councillors, 18 of which are borough mayors
- ✓ each of the 19 borough councils will be made up of at least 5 members: the borough mayor (who is also city councillor) and, as the case may be, for each borough, the city councillor (s) or the borough councillor(s). As to Ville-Marie borough, its council will be made up of the city mayor, who is the city mayor, 3 city councillors elected in each of the 3 electoral districts of that borough, and 2 city councillors chosen by the city mayor from among city councillors.

Tables 1 and 2 provide an overview of the electoral process in each borough and the breakdown of 103 elective offices for the 2009 election.

³ B.C. : Borough council. The council of each borough is made up of at least 5 members and includes the borough mayor (who is also city councillor) and, as the case may be in each borough, of city councillors and borough councillors in the borough. In Ville-Marie borough, however, the city mayor is also the borough mayor.

⁴ Further to order in council 645-2005 of June 23, 2005, which was renewed for the general election of 2009, the territory of L'Île-Bizard—Sainte-Genève borough corresponds to the territory of the former city of L'Île-Bizard and to the territory of the former city of Sainte-Genève; that of Pierrefonds-Roxboro borough corresponds to the territory of the former city of Pierrefonds and to the territory of the former city of Roxboro. The territory of Rivière-des-Prairies—Pointe-aux-Trembles borough corresponds to the territory of the actual territory of that borough, excluding the territory of the former city of Montréal-Est.
