



A general election will be held on **NOVEMBER 5, 2017** to fill the office of city mayor, and the offices of borough mayor, city councillor and borough councillor in the 19 boroughs in Montréal.

CAN YOU VOTE?

To vote, you must be entered on the list of electors, be 18 years of age or older on polling day and meet the following conditions on **September 1, 2017**:

- be a Canadian citizen;
 - not be under curatorship;
 - be:
 - domiciled in Montréal and living in Québec for the past six months;
- OR**
- the owner of an immovable or occupant of a business establishment since at least 12 months.

IS YOUR NAME ENTERED ON THE LIST OF ELECTORS?

You can check by consulting the notice of entry accompanying this leaflet. The name of the elector appears in the box on the upper right-hand side. Remember that to vote, a person must be registered on the list of electors.

CHECK CAREFULLY. IT'S YOUR RESPONSABILITY.

If your name is not on the list, you cannot vote!

If your name does not appear on the notice of entry or if you find errors, you must go, in person, to a board of revisors to have the necessary corrections made in order to enable you to vote.

Please check the yellow document sent with this leaflet for the addresses of the boards of revisors.

WHERE AND WHEN TO VOTE?

You will receive a reminder card (sheet) at your home during the week of **October 23** containing the information you will need to vote on polling day. The names of the candidates for each office will also be listed.

You are unable to vote on November 5? You now have several choices!

You may vote in the advance poll on October 29:

See your reminder card for the address and opening hours of your advance polling station.

You may vote at the returning officer's office on October 27, 30 and 31 and November 1:

You have four additional days to vote at the returning officer's office. Please consult your reminder card for the address and opening hours.

IMPORTANT!

To vote, you must prove your identity by presenting one of the following documents:

- Québec health insurance card
- Québec driver's licence
- Canadian passport
- Certificate of Indian status
- Canadian Armed Forces card

Special measures have been put in place to make it easier for you to vote

- All polling stations are accessible and safe for persons with reduced mobility.
- You may obtain assistance if you are unable to mark your ballot paper.
- In all polling stations, electors will be offered a template, a clipboard and a large pencil.
- People who are deaf or hearing impaired may be accompanied by a person of their choice or an interpreter.

ARE YOU UNABLE TO MOVE ABOUT FOR HEALTH REASONS?

- **You may vote at your domicile**, as well as your caregiver if that person is registered in the same polling subdivision.
- You may ask to **vote in your room**, if you are residing or domiciled in a health care facility, a residential and long-term care centre, a rehabilitation centre or in certain senior's residences.

In both cases, you must fill out the form available on our website (mycitymyvote.ca) and return it by e-mail or regular mail.
